Revise: **tenses (active and passive), modal verbs**

Steve started learning the violin a month ago.      **LEARNING**  
Steve.....the violin for a month.

I haven't been to the Indian restaurant for ages.      **SINCE**  
It's ages.....an Indian restaurant.

It wasn't necessary for me to go out after all.      **HAVE**  
I.....after all.

I think you were wrong to sell your bike.      **SHOULD**  
You.....bike

When you phoned me, it was my lunch time.      **I**  
When you phoned me.....lunch.

David went home before we arrived.      **HAD**  
When we.....home.

This is my first visit to Scotland.      **I**  
This is the first time.....Scotland.

Do you have any plans for Saturday evening?      **DOING**  
What.....Saturday evening?

It's possible that I left my wallet at home.      **COULD**  
I.....my wallet at home.

I am sure that the cat is in the house somewhere.      **BE**  
The cat.....in the house somewhere.

I am sure that John is not the thief.      **BE**  
John.....the thief.

I am certain that Norman will be late.      **BOUND**  
Norman.....late.

How long have Helen and Robert been married?      **GET**  
When.....married?

This is my first game of water-polo.      **PLAYED**  
I.....before.

Have you received your salary yet?      **BEEN**  
Have.....yet?

My parents made me study every night.      **WAS**  
I.....every night by my parents.

Someone will meet you at the airport **BE**  
You.....at the airport.

I started this job five years ago. **BEEN**  
I have.....five years.

The last time Nancy came here was in 1986. **SINCE**  
Nancy hasn't.....1986.

#### MIXED TYPES

You should telephone her. **SPEAK**  
You should.....on the telephone.

The train is due now. **TIME**  
It.....arrived.

I didn't expect to win. **THINK**  
I.....win.

Your brakes are faulty **WRONG**  
There's.....brakes.

I couldn't bear the noise any longer. **PUT**  
I couldn't.....the noise any longer.

The knife was too blunt to cut the bread. **SHARP**  
The knife.....to cut the bread.

I can't move until I've sold my house. **UNABLE**  
Until I've sold my house.....move.

The mouse frightened him. **SCARED**  
He.....the mouse.

I was lost so I asked the way. **BECAUSE**  
I.....I was lost.

The teacher postponed the theatre trip until the summer term. **OFF**  
The theatre trip.....the teacher until the summer term.

George spent ages tidying up his room. **TOOK**  
It.....up his room.

A famous architect designed Mary's house for her. **HAD**  
Mary.....a famous architect.

It was wrong of you to borrow my jacket without asking. **OUGHT**  
You.....before you borrowed my jacket.
